Door County Sheriff's Office Citizen's Academy

The Door County Sheriff's Office Citizen's Academy session is scheduled to begin on Thursday October 21, 2021 and run every Thursday for 10 weeks, ending on Thursday December 30, 2021. The only exception will be Thanksgiving, there will be no class. The classes will run from 6:00 pm – 8:30 pm.

The Citizen's Academy is a 25 hour course. Our goal is to give the community it serves a better understanding of law enforcement operations and procedures.

Citizens attending the academy will receive training in numerous topics within the criminal justice field, with the aim of giving them a basic understanding and familiarity of the "how's and why's" of law enforcement work.

Some of the topics covered in lecture and hands-on exercises include:

- Patrol Procedures/ K-9 applications
- Jail Operations and Procedures
- Court Structure and Criminal Proceedings
- Criminal Investigations
- Vehicle Accident Investigation
- Narcotics Enforcement
- S.W.A.T./Dive and Honor Guard Team Overview
- Use of Force Decision Making
- Firearms Training
- Traffic Stops/OWI Laws/Drug Recognition Officers
- 911/Dispatch Procedures

Requirements - Each applicant to the Academy must meet the following requirements:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Complete and return the Academy application
- Pass a background check
- Must be a Door County resident or work within the county.

This class will be limited to 10 participants.
