

# Fiber to The Premise (FTTP) Municipal Committee Guide

## TOWN BOARD

- Determine if the Board will handle Broadband work or if an ad-hoc committee will be formed
- Give the committee guidance: provider requirements, purpose & goals you have determined
- Include a variety of stakeholders: residents, businesses and anyone who has subject matter expertise

## COMMITTEE HOMEWORK

- Focus on purpose and goals, refer to the municipal guidebook and shared committee work materials
- WISER survey distribution (email & direct mail)
- Review information in the municipal guidebook & Finley Engineering Assessment Report, talk to other committee(s)
- Review and understand the Public Service Commission coverage maps for your area

## COMMITTEE HOMEWORK

- Consider issuing a Request for Information (RFI) to ISP's before scheduling interviews
- Update the Board regularly
- Residential and Business outreach, informational public meetings
- Look over upcoming grants & determine if you have a goal to apply for any

## GRANT WORK

- What grants are currently available and open to apply for and what funding options are available?
- Grant support documentation including survey data
- Ensure you have a letter of intent signed by the Town/Village Board (work to be done after recommendation)
- Letters of support: residents, businesses, school district, County, legislatures for your application(s) (work to be done during applicaiton process)

## REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

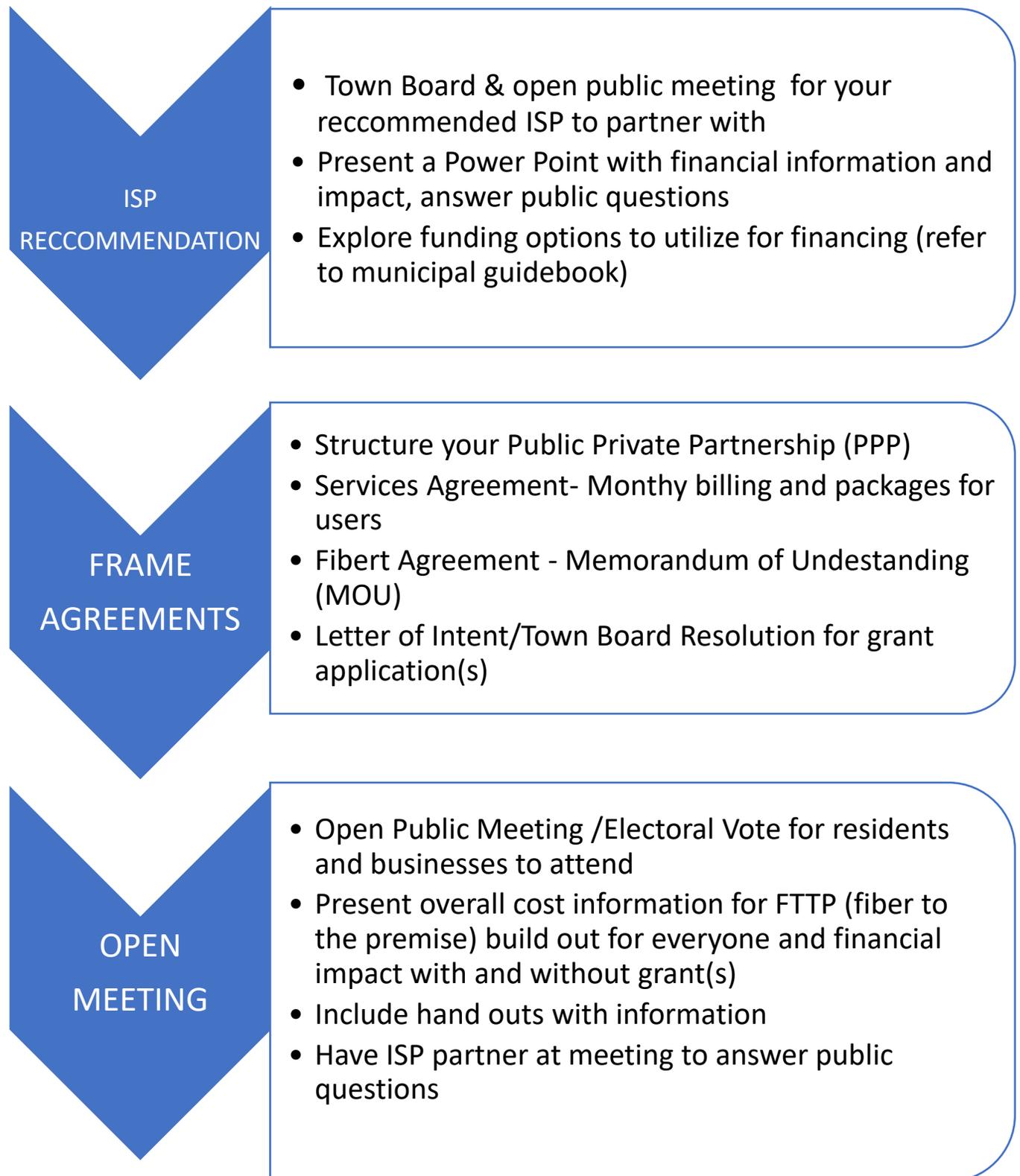
- Send out a RFP (shared work product from Town of Sevastopol) to ISP's to get answers on service packages, network information, overall project cost, matching funds & grant work to compare
- You will use this information to make a recommendation to the Board on an ISP public private partnership (PPP)

## INTERVIEW ISP'S

- Invite Internet Service Providers to meet with the committee to interview them (possibly twice)
- Utilize the RFP information during the interviews
- Get any further requirement answers you want during this meeting to determine a future public private partnership (PPP)

## FINANCIAL HOMEWORK

- Go back to work you did in your grant homework
- Explore funding options prior to grant application (refer to municipal guidebook)
- Get Board approval on your funding option

## GRANT APPROVAL

- If grant is approved work out final agreement with your ISP (your agreement may be to do work regardless of grant awards)
- Finalize services agreement
- Finalize and utilize financial funding
